RED VENT SYNDROME

Andy Locke of the Environment Agency has reported an increasing occurrence of Red Vent syndrome in Salmon stocks; 3 hens in 3 years have been taken from the fish trap on the River Axe at Weycroft. This condition produces swollen and / or bleeding vents in Wild Atlantic salmon.

CHAIRMANS REPORT

Once again another year has flown by all too quickly with the 2009 fishing season being remembered for high levels of rain fall and swollen rivers!

The main events for the year were the approval of the river basement management plans by the Secretary of State following consultation and representation from a number of different bodies. The South West River Basin Plan is a substantial document and concentrates on the pressures facing the water environment and the actions that they feel are required to address them. The full plan can be accessed through the Environment Agency website and I would recommend any of you that are interested to take a few minutes to visit and look at its contents. It will be interesting to see what funding and projects materialize as a direct result of the plan that will in turn effect the River Otter but lets not hold our breath! The South West Rivers Association continues in representing all of us throughout the region and should be fully supported in its efforts in providing the voice of 20 individual River Associations throughout Devon, Cornwall and West Dorset.

2009 has also seen the formation of the Angling Trust in January after a merger of 6 organisations involved in Angling and Fisheries to create a single representative body for Game, Course and Sea Angling. The Trust has been recognized as the national governing body for angling and as such provides a voice at national level which should be supported.

My main plea for 2010 is help and assistance from the membership in supporting and providing information to the association throughout the year. In addition, we are desperate for additional committee members and require an additional 2/3 members with ideally some coming from the lower river. Arm twisting! will be commencing shortly but if you would like to become a committee member then please let me know.

RAINFALL

Rainfall for the year to the 30th September 2009 was 991 mm. This is a little below average which may surprise some people.

Winter level was 590 mm which is about average however the rainfall for the summer period April/September was 401 mm which is below average for this period.

PAUL ELLIOTT 1947-2009

The committee was very sad to hear the death of Paul Eliot in September. Paul was a dedicated SWRA Council Member and a pioneer of eggbox technology in the region. His help and assistance with our eggbox scheme was very much appreciated and he will be sadly missed.

BEAVERS IN THE SOUTH WEST

South West Water plan to introduce beavers to the catchment of Roadford Lake in the Tamar system. The committee have very significant concerns about what is called a 'reintroduction'.

The Environment Agency's position is in line with ours- 'We remain concerned regarding the possible introduction of beaver to the wider Tamar catchment and especially their potential to impact upon migratory salmonid populations. In particular, juvenile salmon habitat and the sedimentation of in stream gravels which would occur through the formation of dams and lodges.'


